**Eleni** from Athens, the physicist, with a PhD in particle physics.

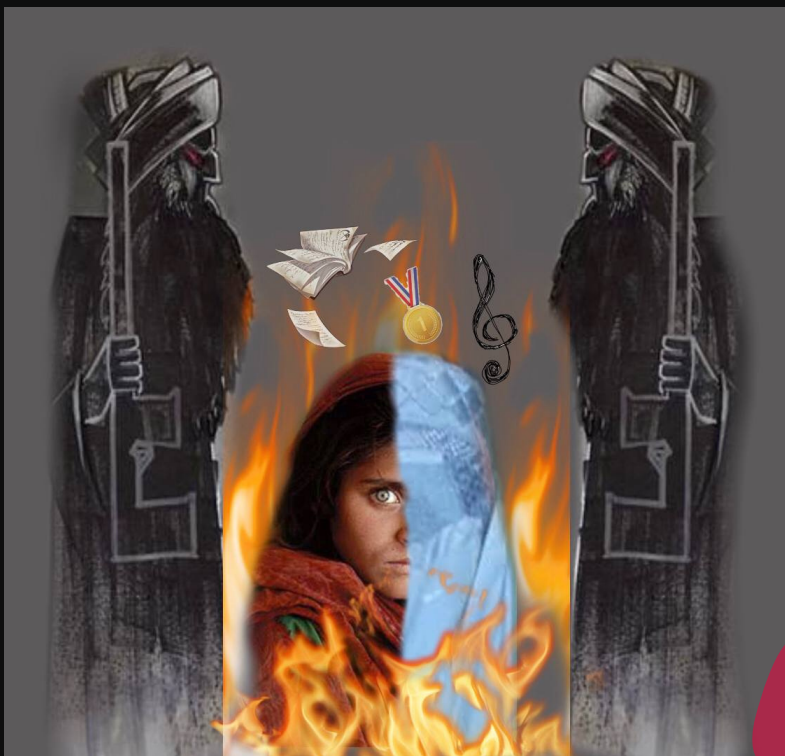
**Sarah** from London, the dancer, preparing for her MA in migration studies.
